



SKY ROOM LOUNGE, at the Municipal Airport in Pendleton, Oregon, affords diners an excellent view of the arriving and departing planes. Breakfast, lunch and dinner served daily. The airport is three and a half miles west of the city, a mile off of U. S. Highway 30.

CLAM CHOWDER

1 cup potatoes, diced
1 small onion, diced
1 ounce butter
2 tablespoons flour
3 cups whole milk
Pinch of pepper
½ teaspoon salt, or to taste
1 8-ounce can minced clams

Simmer potatoes and onions together in small amount of water until tender. Melt butter in small pan, then blend in flour making a smooth paste. Drain juice from clams and blend into butter and flour mixture. Add to cooked potatoes and onions, then stir in milk and clams. Heat to serving temperature, **BUT DO NOT BOIL**. Season to taste and serve. Makes 6-8 portions.
