I had the good fortune to be in the passenger seat on one VERY hot lap in a Ford GT (really a genuine 647hp race car) whose base price is just under \$500,000. It was an incredible ride. I also got to enjoy professionally driven hot laps in two of the new highest powered Mustangs. Thanks go out to three of my good friends with Media credentials for making these extraordinary rides possible at the Barrett-Jackson auction at Mohican Sun. Anyone have a spare \$500K so I can apply to be chosen as a future owner?

Every Labor Day for the last few years TWO major car shows have been competing with each other. The older of the two, "Lead East, The World's Largest Fifties Party" takes place at the Hilton Hotel and surrounding office complex in Parsippany, NJ. Thirty miles North on I-287 brings you to "Dead Man's Curve" which takes place at the Sheraton Hotel in Mahwah, NJ, just south of the junction of I-287, NJ-17 and the NY Thruway.

Lead East focuses on older cars, especially customs and hot rods, and the music they play LOUDLY is any Rock and Roll up to but not including the Beatles. This year they claimed to have 35 bands and Doo Wop groups. Dead Man's Curve is a little more inclusive, permitting customs, hot rods, funny cars, antiques, dragsters, you name it. Here the music does include the Beatles and any Rock including the 70's and possibly 80's, so, predictably, the crowd here is somewhat younger than Lead East.

I spent some time at both shows and came across a few Falcons, but none so outrageous as "Economac," a completely custom made vehicle built to appear as a cab-over, tilt-front tractor trailer I spotted at Lead East.



It began life as a '67 Econoline van. It was cut just behind the more forward of the two right side cargo doors. Then just the last few inches of the back of the truck were re-installed onto the body. My estimate is that approximately 3 to 4 feet of body were removed. The chassis is completely custom fabricated. The engine is a 351W. Power is driven through a T5 manual 5-speed transmission. The differential is from a Mustang. It has twin rear axles.

Although it has a very real looking "fifth wheel" (the device made to connect to the trailer) it is NOT functional. The color is 2012 Jeep Gecko Green.

The owners, Dale and Judy Scully, of Bethel CT took 14 years to go from concept to prize-winning truck. I often ask myself, "Why do people do this type of thing?" The answer, of course, is that they CAN (and I can't). The workmanship is outstanding! This has to be about the coolest trucks I have ever seen.
